CHRISHALL WI NEWS

Chrishall WI meet on the 3rd Wednesday of the month in the Village Hall, Crawley End at 7:15 for a 7:30 pm start.



We had a talk in September from a lady giving us shocking information about the number of chemicals in personal care products such as toothpaste, bubble baths, baby wipes and shampoo including the fact that one in eight of these are considered toxic. They are entering our blood streams and can affect our health. She encouraged us to read the lists of ingredients in the products we are buying.

We hosted our Autumn Supper in September and provided a meal for fifty people. We were entertained by an excellent singing group – Fiona McGlashin’s Acapella – who encouraged group participation!

Our speaker in October told us about “Music Therapy”. She works for an organisation that offers people with brain injury or neurological trauma support through the specialist use of music as part of their rehabilitation. They work in partnership with a huge range of other partners and with all ages from small children to older people wherever there is a need. The therapists work sensitively with and respond to what a person can do, whatever the effects of their trauma, by listening to their movement, breathing and vocal sounds even if speech has been hindered or lost.

Also in October we hosted a WI Group meeting, with members from four other Institutes joining us. We had a very enjoyable evening with a freelance Auctioneer entertaining us with anecdotes from his career. Members had been invited to bring antique objects along for him to look at and he spoke at length about these in a very amusing and informative way. One item was quite valuable but unfortunately no-one else had any pleasant surprises about the worth of their antiques! We ended the evening with a delicious buffet.

We have had a busy, but very enjoyable few months.

The Trust was founded in 1989 on the death of Mr William Walter Brand, a local farmer and landowner. It was incorporated in 1994 and commenced its duties from September 1995. As a village, we are very fortunate to have the Trust, whose aim is to give support to those in our community who are in need, hardship or distress.

Subject to funds being available, the Trustees will consider applications for help with costs related to education including transport costs, school outings, and a grant to help pay for secondary school uniforms. We can also help with providing "Lifeline" wristband or pendant personal alarms, disability aids, essential furniture and kitchen equipment, heating, medical and respite care. Group organisation applications can cover help with setting up new groups, sporting activities and equipment.

We are also able to offer a winter fuel allowance. If you missed the heating allowance form in the Autumn newsletter, please contact one of the trustees listed below for an application form.

We understand that some people might be reluctant to come forward for help, but it's important that we include everyone who can benefit from the Trust. CHRISHALL VILLAGE ARCHIVE

The Archive has had a very successful 2019 with new items coming into the collection and new connections made.

This year we extended our display with a new piece of research around Chrishall Windmill. This research was carried out by Richard Keeling and Helen Melville-Smith and formed the basis for the new display boards in the collection. Whilst there is no trace of it now, the windmill stood on Mill Causeway for at least 200 years and must have been a major factor in Chrishall's skyline. As a reminder Fred Davies built us a wonderful model of a post-mill, the type of mill that would have stood in Chrishall. And this has been much admired during the year.

It was the windmill display that we took to Saffron Walden Museum's Castle Day in June. Whilst turnout for the local history displays was lower than expected, it was quality over quantity as we met some fascinating people during the day so it was well worth doing.

In August we had a visit by May Hicks and her family. May lived at Mullion Cottage in the 1950s and Mr and Mrs Rodda were kind enough to show May around her old home which she had not been back to since they left in 1960. May's daughter Kim had searched out some old photographs which we were able to copy and also brought a painting of May that was done by their artist neighbour at Mullion in 1942.

We have been able to add to the Brand collection of documents by being loaned a personal collection of papers that we have been able to copy. This fascinating selection goes right back to the early 1800s and includes a description of how Mr Brand spent Christmas Day in 1850 (mostly a series of visits and dining including Christmas dinner at The Red Cow!).

We are very grateful to have been loaned Mullion Deeds to copy for the collection, and with deeds you never know what you are going to find. In these deeds were many interesting facts, including the answer to a long term village mystery. Who owned the village charabang?? (It was Mr John Whitmore in case you were wondering). If you have the deeds to your house and would be prepared to loan them so we can make a copy, please do let us know.

Also in August the CAG Committee visited Ashdon Museum and enjoyed looking round their amazing collection. Something for Chrishall to aim for in years to come!

Finally, by the time you read this, we will have held our major event of the year which is 'Art and Archive', an exhibition with SOCA (the Society of Chrishall Artists) and CAG (Chrishall Archive Group) on Saturday 23rd November. In the evening we are having a talk by Christopher South and Tom Doig. Currently I am writing this article amidst a sea of paper cuttings, folders, table plans and notes. By the time you read this I hope it will all have come together and everyone will have enjoyed the day!

Building Works

The builders have now started work on the new Church north aisle roof following the theft of lead in September 2018.

THE BRAND PAVILION

It is now just over six months since the Pavilion User Group came into being, made up of representatives of the various groups that regularly use the building. We support the Parish Council in its operation of the Pavilion as a cricket club, library, village archive and a community hub for residents of Chrishall and the surrounding villages.

The Pavilion was at the heart of two major village events over the summer as well as the annual charity cricket match. We also host an after-school club which started in September.

All of these events generate funds that will allow much-needed improvements to the building to be made. Volunteers from the user groups also donate their time to carry out repairs and maintenance on the building.

We were fortunate to receive a grant from Uttlesford District Council to upgrade our external lighting and this has now been installed, making access safer for the clubs using the grounds in the evening as well as parents collecting children from after-school clubs. The Cricket Club generously funded additional roof insulation, and our sincere thanks go to Ian Rogers of Phoenix Partnership for installing this without charge.

We have a number of fund-raising initiatives in the pipeline, including the sale of calendars featuring scenes of the village and its flora and fauna painted by members of the Society of Chrishall Artists. These are available from the Red Cow or by sending a message via the Chrishall Parish Council Facebook page.

We are planning to hold monthly drop-in coffee and cake mornings from January 2020 – come and meet us!

We would like to reiterate that everyone is very welcome to use the Pavilion. We have a calendar of events on the PC website at www.chrishallpc.org.uk (go to 'Brand Pavilion') allowing you to see what's on and when the Pavilion is available.

Correspondence: Please note that if you want any issue to be considered by the Parish Council, it must be sent or delivered to the Clerk as this is the official route for all correspondence to be formally considered by the Council.

Parish Council finances: The Parish Council is committed to providing value for money and to that end, is investigating potential schemes which will support this aim. The PC is working on a village-wide survey, which will ask each household for an indication of where it wants the PC to spend the precept. Look out for this in the spring.

Dog waste: Dog waste continues to be a problem so please do pick up.

Defibrillator: The defibrillator is in a cabinet on the outside of the village hall.

Bonfires: Please do consider your neighbours and restrict lighting bonfires to early evening. A better option is to use the green bin scheme provided by Uttlesford District Council which will take all green garden waste.

You are also reminded that mammals including hedgehogs may have set up home in the bottom of a pile of debris which is destined to be burned. Please check thoroughly for little mammals and birds before you light – even better, only build the bonfire on the day of the burn and don't build it and leave it for little creatures to make their homes.

It is illegal to burn plastics and furniture as they release toxic fumes and leave toxic residues – they should be taken to the recycling centre for professional disposal.

You are also asked to be aware of livestock in adjacent fields and ensure smoke does not drift over animals, other households, and is well away from thatched roofs.

Health & Welfare: The PC mental health training event is full, but if you are interested the PC may be able to host a second event. If you would like to attend please contact the Clerk.

Uttlesford District Council declares a Climate Change & Ecological Emergency: The Parish Council is considering tree planting as a carbon off-setting scheme. It is also considering holding an event to highlight where individuals can make a difference and reduce carbon footprint.

Swap and Share, Give and Take:



If you have surplus produce, please take it to the bus shelter in Palmers Lane to swap and share with other villagers.

There is also an open notice board in the bus shelter for people to share information.

The Pavilion: The loft insulation has been fitted, and applications for grant funding to install a heating system are ongoing.

2019 VILLAGE CHRISTMAS FAIR

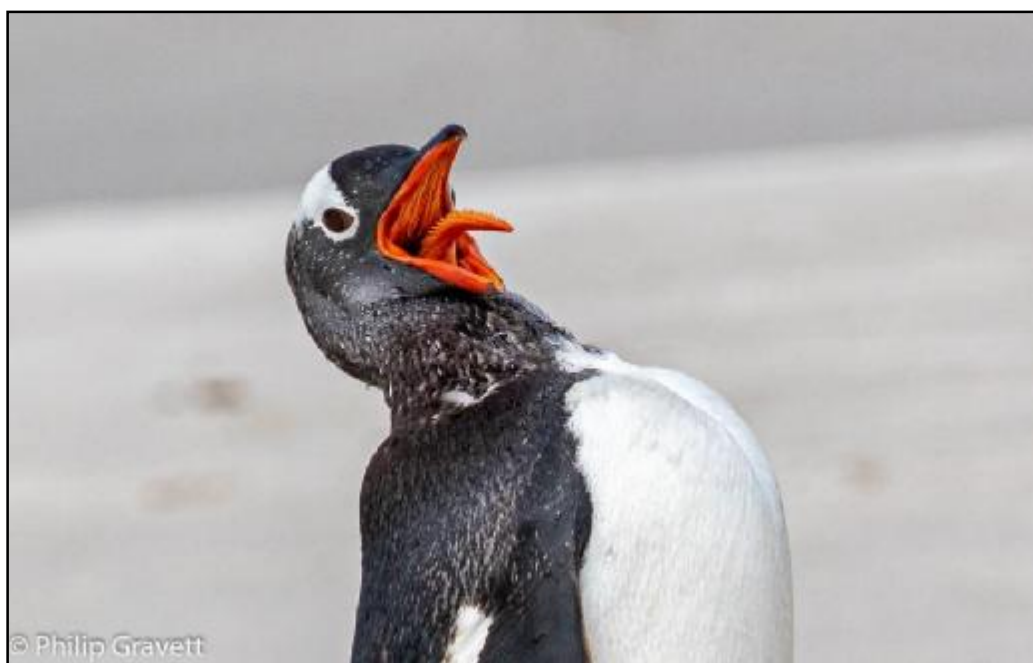
