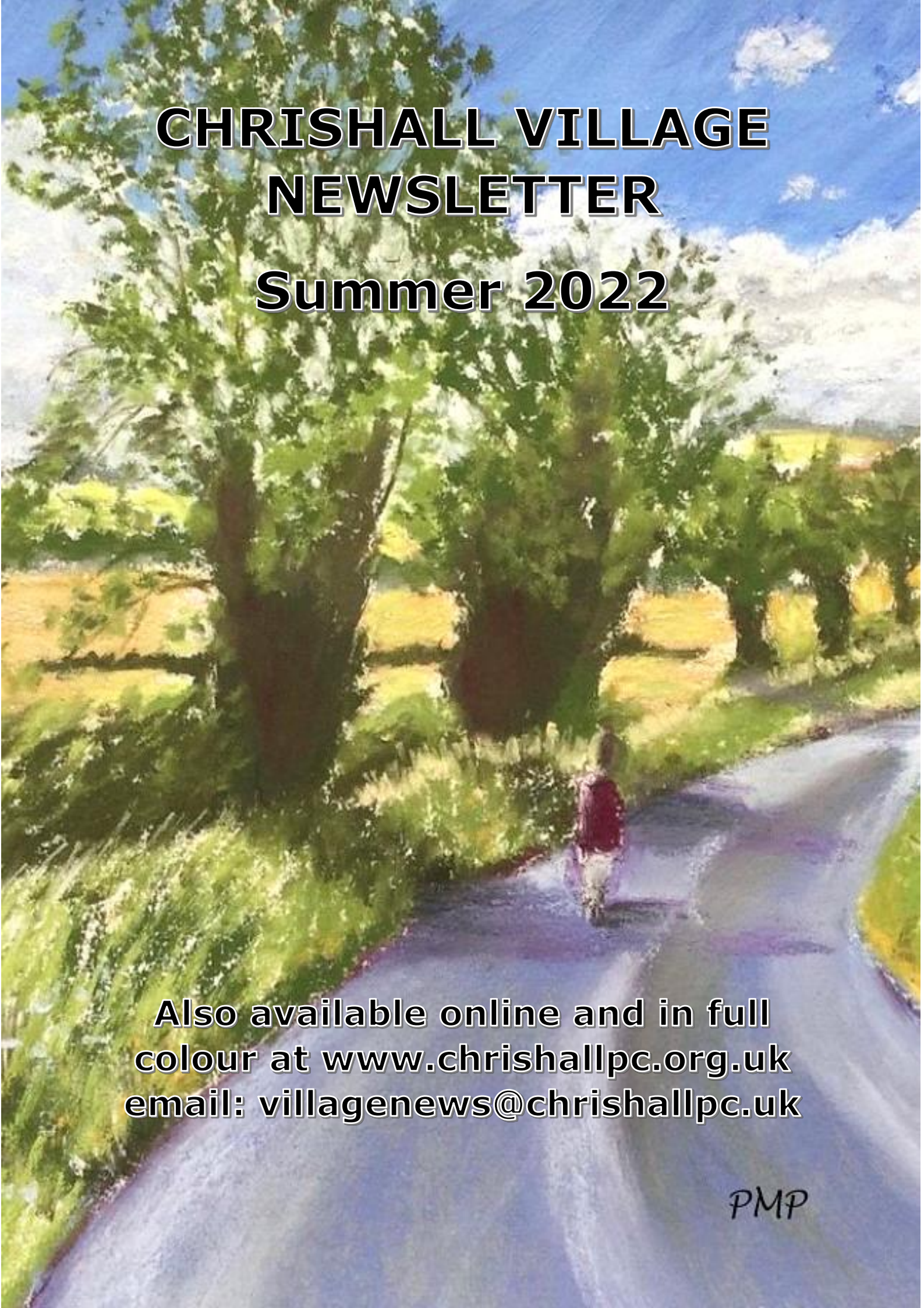

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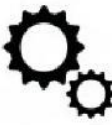

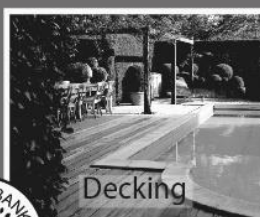

CHANGES TO THE TELEPHONE SYSTEM - DIGITAL VOICE

No Need to Worry

BT has been rolling out Digital Voice locally. Once your BT landline phone service has been migrated to work through your BT Hub (router), i.e. via the internet, you will no longer be able to make calls during a power cut.

BT has recently put the roll-out on hold while they look into providing local battery back-up in areas where mobile phone services are not available. Also, they will look at how to continue providing phone services where a customer does not have internet access at all.

The message is that there is **no need to worry**, for the moment.

The roll-out will most likely recommence in a few months' time, and this magazine will contain updates when necessary.

Sky Customers

In the meantime, for those of you who have Sky Broadband Ultrafast or Sky Broadband Ultrafast Plus, and possibly Sky Broadband Superfast, Sky too ultimately will be providing a digital phone service, which they call 'Internet Calls'. When BT resumes its 'Digital Voice' roll-out, Sky customers will need to take Sky's 'Internet Calls' service because their BT landline phone service will no longer work.

Gigaclear Customers

For Gigaclear customers, it is not clear whether Gigaclear is yet offering a digital voice service. Once Gigaclear can offer such a service, Gigaclear customers with existing BT phone service will need to take up Gigaclear's digital voice service, as their BT phone service will no longer work when BT converts their landline phone service to Digital Voice.

Other Internet Service Providers' Customers

The same situation will arise for phone service customers of all the other internet service providers (ISP), as they all have to offer digital voice services by 2025. Any customer with an internet service not provided by BT will have to change their landline phone service to their own internet service provider. BT will give notice of the change and won't cease the BT landline phone service until its customers have changed their phone service over to their respective ISP.

CHRISHALL VILLAGE HALL

Chrishall Village Hall committee held its AGM on 13 April with its chairman acknowledging the work of everyone involved in helping to ride the wave of the pandemic.



Despite Covid-19 disrupting the general running of the hall over the past two years, chairman Richard Keeling gave thanks to fellow committee members, regular hirers and the village hall's group of 'young cleaners' who have all contributed to the effort in their own way, supporting the village hall since it fully opened at the start of August 2021.

Anticipating further challenges ahead, he said: 'While we will need to keep an eye on the rising cost of fuel, the big challenges over the coming months for the Village Hall Committee will be to try to increase the number of bookings and make sure the Village Hall remains a popular local amenity.'

But added: 'It is almost eight years now since the Parish Council bought the Methodist chapel and hall and the purchase has so far turned out to be a good one for Chrishall.'

On the financial front, treasurer Helen Melville-Smith reported that the committee obtained a second grant of £2,600 from the government's Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Covid-19 fund, boosting much-needed reserves.

Additionally, she revealed the current year's figures showed an overall income for the year ending 31 March 2022 of £11,172 against an expenditure total of £8,066. This gives a working excess of £3,106 for the year.

The 100 club renewals are due in June/July and it is hoped all members will renew their subscriptions.

For those keen to get involved and support the village hall 100 Club funding, they can obtain an application form from Helen at helen.ms@gmail.com.

Meanwhile, upcoming plans for the village hall include the renewal of the oil tank, the sanding back and polishing of the floor in the south hall and a general freshening up of the interior décor.

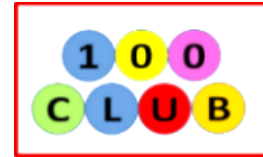

Paula Parish – Friends of Brand Pavilion

WILLIAM WALTER BRAND TRUST

Helping those who live within the Chrishall Parish Boundary

The core remit of the Brand Trust is to provide assistance to those who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress and, as a result, need financial assistance to address these conditions.

Examples of the types of assistance the Trust can provide include:

- help towards the purchase of essential household items
- help towards the payment of electricity & water bills
- help towards the purchase and/or installation and/or maintenance of disability aids such as stairlifts
- help with educational needs such as computer/laptop, sports, school trips.
- A cold weather/cost of living grant of up to £400 is available this year.

We are also in a position to assist with:

School Uniform: a grant of £200 is available for all those proceeding to state secondary schools for their first year. An application form for the 2022 allowance is available opposite. Requests for subsequent years can be made via a "need, hardship or distress" request.

School Transport: For those students attending state secondary schools where the County Council does not provide free transport, the Trust is in a position to help with some of the transport costs for those in need.

Further Education: The Trust awards grants to those going on to further education, i.e. university, apprenticeships or adult further education. The maximum grant is £1,000

We understand that some people might be reluctant to come forward for help, but it is important that we include everyone who can benefit from the Trust. Parish Council meetings for 2022:

Parish Council Meetings 28th June, 27th September, 29th November
Meetings start at 7:30pm

Annual Parish Meeting:

The Annual Parish Meeting took place on the 26th April in the village hall. Dr Peter Gough gave a stirring presentation on the work Khandel Light does. However, it left many concerned at the lack of water and consequently food in Rajasthan, and demonstrated how the rest of the world may be impacted unless we all take action to stem carbon and methane emissions. Uttlesford District Councillor Richard Pavitt spoke about the dire straits of our local chalk rivers, with all being affected by abstraction and pollution. His message was we need to clean up and protect our waterways which will improve biodiversity. Cllr Gregory commented on the difficulties the Parish Council has encountered particularly over the past 10 months. Cllr Gadd gave a detailed report on the lack of action from Essex County Council on Climate Change. He commented that whilst there is a policy to provide more cycleways, there is no intention to provide them due to lack of planning.

The number one takeaway from the meeting was that everyone needs to reduce water consumption.

Chrishall Parish Council will review its response to these vital issues and to form an action plan to move us forward in a carbon reduction but ecologically improving future. We need the community's help to do this. We have had an offer of ecological surveying assistance which is so welcome. We need everyone to make comments on what you would like the Parish Council to do in response to climate change and ecological disaster – if we don't get feedback, we will have to use our best judgement to take things forward.

We also had presentations from village organisations including: Brand Trust, Cricket Club, Village Hall, WI, Society of Chrishall Artists, and the Jubilee Committee. The meeting was very informative.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Commemoration: To date, no suggestions have come forward for a permanent commemoration. The Parish Council will therefore rely on its small band of volunteers to take a decision.

Highways Issues: all landowners and householders are reminded that it is their responsibility to maintain hedges and ditches which have a public highway as a boundary. Please do not cut hedges now.

Parish Council vacancy: We have five vacancies which are open to residents, property owners and people who work in the parish. We need people who care about our parish to come forward and contribute as part of our team of volunteers. There are several important issues which need our full attention, and you are urged to consider whether you can assist us.

Parish Council owned buildings and assets: update:

By the time that this newsletter goes to print the second phase of the repairs and maintenance work to the village hall should be complete. At the time of writing the roof repairs have been completed except for some pointing of ridge tiles. The Chapel windows have been repaired and repainting is underway. The porch has been dry lined, decorated, and the refurbished doors will soon be rehung. Your Council



extends a big thank you again to Wilby & Burnett for overseeing all the work and managing the contract and to Rose Hill Construction for their professionalism and hard work. Also thank you to Richard Keeling and Michael Dearman for liaising with Wilby & Burnett and Rose Hill. Your support is very much appreciated.

New doors and windows have been installed in the pavilion mainly financed by a donation received from Mrs Vivienne Dalling, a member of the Brand Family. Our thanks go to her. Pictures and more about the Brand pavilion can be seen on page 11.

Reinstatement of the red telephone box in Palmers Lane: we are waiting delivery of the phone box which will be a mini-library.



The Chambers Pond railings have been renovated. Thanks to Mr Richard Smith for undertaking the task and doing a wonderful job.

The bus shelter has been repainted by a team of volunteers, Tony and Julie Bisset, and Carol Wootton and is now looking very smart. Many thanks to the team. It is intended to move the dog waste bin further away from the shelter.

Ponds: The Parish Council owns Chambers Pond, outside Martinholme, and Broad Green Pond. Both ponds contain Great Crested Newts and residents are reminded that these are a protected species.

Biodiversity and Ecology: The Parish Council would draw attention to legislation around watercourse, ponds and protected species. Your attention is drawn to <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/owning-a-watercourse> which the Parish Council must comply with. Garden debris must not be deposited within 10 metres of a water course or pond. Chemical runoff should not be allowed to enter a watercourse or pond.

Community Corner: The Palmers Lane bus shelter was used to varying levels of success for vegetable swap and share last year and the Parish Council also installed a notice board for public use. Your Council will resume this important use of the bus shelter and would ask that it be respected please.

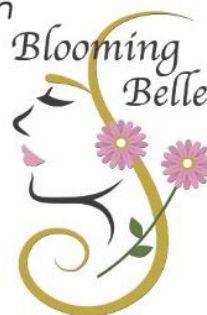
